What are you passionate about? _____

Criteria:

- Determine what it is you are passionate about.
- Find a way to teach that to a small group (3-4) of your classmates.
- You are the teacher, so you will need to design a **lesson plan** that you can use while teaching your topic.

To be submitted:

- A lesson plan

TENTATIVE Teaching day: **Tuesday, September 10th**

You will be given time today, and Monday. You are free to spend some time over the weekend thinking about this. USE YOUR TIME WISELY.

SAMPLE:

My friend has a passion for card games. She taught us how to play a card game with many rules. She first gave instructions and then lead a demonstration game for us to practice.

She typed up a lesson plan with key information to remember. For the demonstration game she provided the cards and had us sit around a table.

Lesson: Teaching a small group of students to play "Speed"
Materials: 2 decks of cards
Objective: to be the first player to play all the cards in your deck and call out "Speed!"
Preparation: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Players sit across from one another at the table.- Deal 20 cards face down to each player.- Deal the remaining cards face down between the two players in 4 piles (two outside piles with 5 cards, and two inside piles with only 1 card).
Key points: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Keep 5 cards in your hand at all times.- The number order can go both up and down.- When neither player has a card that will play on the center piles, simultaneously flip one card over from the outer face-down stacks. (If these stacks run out of cards, turn the face-up piles over to face-down and start again using the top card.)- Allow for pauses in the demonstration game, so questions can be asked.
